

Capital Region/North Country RAEN Director Job Posting- April 2021

The Regional Adult Education Network (RAEN) is the statewide system of staff development for educators and administrators in adult education programs funded by New York State Office of Adult Career and Continuing Education Services- Adult Education Program and Policies (ACCES-AEPP). The Capital Region/North Country RAEN, serving 18 counties in upstate NY, is one of seven RAENs providing technical assistance and professional development to adult literacy, occupational, and continuing education programs. Each RAEN director plans & implements high quality, research-based professional development as well as assists programs in meeting or exceeding statewide benchmarks of the National Reporting System.

Literacy New York (LNY) maintains the contract for the Capital Region/North Country RAEN. This funding falls under the Workforce Investment Act Title II from through NYS ACCES-AEPP. The current contract spans five years, beginning October 2019 and concluding September 2024.

- Connect funded adult education programs with the workforce development system, including NYS Department of Labor American Job Centers in each local workforce investment area.

- Assist adult education program providers in aligning adult education with postsecondary education and WIOA
 Title 1 training and apprenticeship, to ensure smooth transitions to education and training.
- Facilitate training on the Adult Student Information System and Technical Support/National Reporting System (ASISTS) in cooperation with the AEPP and the Literacy Assistance Center (LAC) or any subsequent ASISTS vendor.
- Facilitate training on the NRS in cooperation with the AEPP regional liaison and the NRS Accountability Specialist
 or any subsequent accountability vendor. Facilitate training on any other monitoring system employed by NYSED
 for ACCES-AEPP programs.
- Assist the AEPP in monitoring the quality of the data submitted for the NRS/state performance.
- Provide professional development in digital literacy for teachers and administrators in order to prepare adult students for college and career readiness and HSE diploma success.
- Increase practitioner knowledge and skills relevant to providing services that are effective and appropriate to the needs of adults with learning disabilities
- Support Literacy Zones
- Share best practices in building effective partnerships; providing instruction in reading, language, math, health literacy, financial literacy, digital literacy and family literacy; and increasing parent involvement in their children's education, within the Literacy Zones.
